Cox, Alice Marie age 95, returned to her Heavenly Father and to be reunited with her beloved husband William D. Cox Jr. whom she met and married while in college at Tennessee State University. She was the apple of her husband's eye. She passed September 27th, 2015 at Rivers Edge Nursing Home where she has resided since becoming disabled.
