“ It was in the late 60’s when we first met Felix. I was a graduate student in Physics at Purdue University in West Lafayette, Indiana. My cousin Philip and Felix stopped by for a visit and shared a steak fondu at our apartment. Philip had been a Peace Corps volunteer in Nigeria where he became close friends with Felix and his family (particularly his mother). I had been a PC volunteer myself in Ghana, West Africa (1964-66) and had traveled through Nigeria so I had some acquaintance with Felix’s homeland. We met again sometime after 1975 at the University of Cincinnati where Felix was the Artist-in-Residence and I was a faculty member in Radiology, Medical Physics. Our paths intertwined often in Cincinnati and over recent years we had a Thanksgiving tradition of dinner at Felix’s Hyde Park home where, on these occasions, he would prepare a magnificent turkey with African style stuffing. A number of times we were joined by Grace, her husband Chris, and their two lovely daughters. Felix was a sculptor par excellence and his wood masterpieces are a marvel to behold. We are proud to be the owners of one such piece – ‘The Chief First Lady’ that stands just over 7-foot tall and exudes a majestic presence in our home. I do believe it was one of Felix’s favorite works. Through this sculpture and many fond memories, the spirit of Felix lives on in our hearts.
