Rev. Dr. Johnnie D. Clark, Pastor Emeritus of the Burnett Avenue Baptist Church, Louisville, Kentucky peacefully entered into eternal rest during the early morning hours of July 21, 2018. Rev. Clark retired from the US Postal Service where he held positions as Manager, Investigator and Interim Postmaster for 32 years. He answered our nation's call to arms and served during the Korean War with the 45th Infantry Division.
