“*Luda (as he was known to his students) was my first computer programming teacher, at the J. Graham Brown School, in the 1979-1980 school year. He taught me to program the Board of Education’s Honeywell Series 6000 mainframe, which was housed at VanHoose Education Center. From the school, we would use a rotary dial telephone, acoustic coupled modem, and a Teletype ASR-33 to access the computer. Only one student could use the computer at a time. Luda patiently helped me to read the BASIC programming manual, in its three-ring binder. It was the first technical computer documentation I ever read. Later, in high school, the school got its first microcomputers and I served as Luda’s teaching assistant for the middle school programming class, one student of which I have worked with professionally in later life. It was as entertaining to watch Luda teach others, as it was illuminating to teach me. He is missed, and celebrated by me. I am currently working on a project to fix a bug in an old classic computer chip, by adding supplemental circuitry, and I am naming the project after Luda. Condolences to his family, friends, and fellow former students.*

His exemplary service to others in the classroom, on the mat and so many other walks of his life, have impacts far exceeding the naked eye; a “CHARGER” who changed the world!

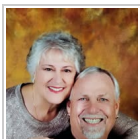
